Demonstrative pronouns - *this*, *that*, *these* and *those* - are used to identify nouns within and out of the speaker's reach.

Uses

- *that* is for singular objects out of the speaker's reach
- *this* is for singular objects within the speaker's reach
- *those* is for plural objects out of the speaker's reach
- *these* is for plural objects within the speaker's reach

Example

That man is my father.
→

This boy is my son.
→

Those are my friends.
→

These pencils are blue.
→

NOTE: Only *That is* can be contracted: *That's*.
